Is suiteáil ealaíne spreagúil agus tarraingteach é SWARM a chruthaigh 450 páiste bunscoile agus a gcuid múinteoirí ó 25 bunscoil i Maigh Eo, i Sligeach agus i nGaillimh. Is toradh é SWARM ar chomhoibriú 10-mí idir NMI - Roinn Oideachais Pháirc Thurlaigh agus an t-ealaíontóir Cas McCarthy atá lonnaithe i Maigh Eo.

Ag tosú le cuairt ar thaispeántas Murmur of Bees, d'fhoghlaim na rannpháirtithe faoi bheacha na hÉireann, a ról ríthábhachtach inár n-éiceachórais, agus an nasc domhain cultúrtha a roinneann muid leo, ag síoradh ar éiceolaíocht, bithéagsúlacht agus iontais an domhain nádúrtha.

Arna spreagadh ag a gcuid foghlama, rinne na mic léinn a gcuid feithidí a thógáil agus a phéinteáil, rud a thug beatha dóibh trí iniúchadh a dhéanamh ar dhathanna, ar phatrúin agus ar dhearadh.

SWARM is an exciting and engaging art installation created by 450 primary school children and their teachers from 25 primary schools in Mayo, Sligo and Galway. SWARM is the outcome of a 10-month collaboration between the NMI - Turlough Park Education Department and Mayo-based artist Cas McCarthy.

Beginning with a visit to The Murmur of Bees exhibition, participants learned about Ireland's bees, their crucial role in our ecosystems, and the deep cultural bond we share with them, delving into ecology, biodiversity and the wonders of the natural world.

Inspired by their learning, students constructed and painted their insects, bringing them to life through an exploration of colours, patterns and design.



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
