
Lobster Pot




What is it?

Lobster pots were fishing traps for catching lobsters. The pot in the NMI Handling Collection was made from willow in 2001 by Joe Hogan, Loch Na Fooey, Co Galway.

What was it used for?

Bait was placed in the pot to attract the lobster. The pots had a funnel-type entrance so the lobster could easily get in, but found it hard to get out.

A buoy was tied to the trap before it was sunk into the water. This acted as a marker for the fisherman to locate the trap, and then to use the rope to pull up the pot.



Lobster pot fishing became widespread during the 19th century in order to provide lobster to the London and Paris markets. In fact, lobster was rarely eaten at home.

Brief History

Lobster fishing usually took place during the summer and autumn months.

In some areas, lobster pots were made from heather. These pots resembled seaweed. Although harder to construct, they were stronger than hazel and willow pots, and lasted up to three years.

Ceanglaíodh bulla leis an ngaiste sula gcuireadh é isteach san uisce. D'fheidhmigh sé seo mar mharcóir don iascaire chun an gaiste a aimsiú, agus ina dhiaidh sin chun an téad a úsáid chun an pota a tharraingt ón uisce.



Faoin 19ú haois, bhí iascaireacht ghliomaigh forleathan chun gliomaigh a sholáthar do mhargaí i Londain agus i bPáras. Go deimhin, is annamh a itheadh gliomaigh sa bhaile.

Stair Ghairid
